Tracked Wheelchair for Use (free)

The Eden Chapter of Wings Over Wisconsin recently purchased a tracked wheelchair for sportsmen/women with physical challenges. It is free to use and also has a trailer that it is towed in. To reserve the track wheelchair or for more information, please contact Larry Luedtke at 920-960-7986.

Adaptive Sportsmen has two accessible tree stands for loan. These are free to use by our members. Checkout is first come, first serve. You will need a trailer or pickup truck to haul them. The Small Capacity lift will lift a disabled person up 12 feet, using a portable drill which is included with the lift. You need to be able to transfer to the padded swivel seat. The Large Capacity lift will lift a disabled person in a wheelchair up 8 feet, using a portable drill (included).
