

We are planning to hold it again next year and hope to get a better turnout. We have seven wheelchair accessible cabins, a 360 acre lake for fishing, and a beautiful and extensive atv trail system to ride on. This has been a fun event in the past and we expect to have many more in the future. Polaris has been able to let us use two Razor ATV's, through the Wisconsin ATV Association (WATVA). Greg Olsen has been a big help bringing the two ATV's in and supplying drivers for them. So if you ever wanted to go atv riding but didn't want to drive we have just the opportunity for you at this ride. We hope to see you up in Mercer next year.
