Great unique fly fishing opportunity I recently participated in. It was for smallmouth bass. The trip is about a 4-hour float down the Oconto River just north of Green Bay. The guide was super adaptive as I've never fly fished before. I was able to get in the boat with ease. Someone could use a slid-board to transfer from their wheelchair to a standard boat seat and fish. John (Captain/guide) is also going to be adding an additional wood platform to be able to accommodate fishing from your own wheelchair (if needed) as well. This is the only guide I've even been around that provided water, beef sticks, bug spray and sunscreen as complementary items. Cost was \$300 for the trip, but well worth it. Day 3 was nice with w/slight breeze & 1 kill. Day 4 I had a bear come in and huff at me from 40-50 yards but never a visual. With my bait hit 2 nights in a row. I had hope that day 5 might be the one, but no luck. Even though I did not harvest a bear I still had a great time, met many nice people and would recommend Lance & his crew to any one. With one other bear taken on day 4 the total was 7 in 4 days. Again I want to thank Craig and his wife for this great experience!!

My name is John Martinson, I'm a proud board member of SCI Badgerland Chapter, Vice Chairman Adaptive Sportsmen Inc. and also participated as a hunter in the Feather Ridge game farm disabled pheasant hunt, I'm also paralyzed at the thoracic 8 level (just below my nipples) from a fall at my house nineteen years ago. I grew up on a farm and had plenty of experiences pheasant hunting which I loved to do as a kid. SCI Badgerland supported this event not only money- wise but, volunteer- wise!

The action track wheelchairs allowed me and the other disabled hunters to have the freedom to be able to go into the marsh and they lean back to give me support to hold my shotgun up, because I have no abdominal muscles. We use pointer dogs (which are exciting to watch work) that will hold the bird till we get into position to shoot, because we are limited with our range of motion shooting area.

Dog handlers take two to three hunters into the fields at a time along the chopped paths that allow the hunters to get through the heavy marsh with their action track wheelchairs
